Dear Association Member,

The Alabama Trucking Association Safety and Maintenance Management Council (SMMC) conducts the annual safety contest. This SMMC-sponsored event demonstrates the extreme importance the trucking industry places on highway safety. The contest includes:

- **2022 FLEET SAFETY CONTEST.** Based on accident frequency, measured by the number of accidents per million miles in which your drivers were involved in 2022. Only accidents that occurred in Alabama and miles run in Alabama are considered in the computation.
- 2022 DRIVER OF THE YEAR AWARD. Every ATA trucking company member has drivers who are deserving of recognition by their company, whether they win the contest or not. The prestige of simply being nominated goes a long way toward improved driver morale and retention. The winning driver is presented with a trophy and is invited to be our guest at the 2023 Annual Meeting in Destin, Florida.
- 2022 SAFETY PROFESSIONAL OF THE YEAR AWARD. This award goes to the individual who, in the opinion of the judges, has done the most to promote highway safety within his/her company, community, state and the Alabama Trucking Association. The winning professional is presented with a trophy and is invited to be our guest at the 2023 Annual Meeting in Destin, Florida.
- 2022 MAINTENANCE PROFESSIONAL OF THE YEAR. This award is presented to the individual who effectively supervises the maintenance department of a member company while improving efficiencies and lowering maintenance costs. The winning professional is presented with a trophy and is invited to be our guest at the 2023 Annual Meeting in Destin, Florida.
- 2022 FLEET MANAGER OF THE YEAR AWARD. This award is presented to the individual that has a proven track record in managing a fleet of drivers who consistently exceed expectations of the fleet as a whole. The winning professional is presented with a trophy and is invited to be our guest at the 2023 Annual Meeting in Destin, Florida.

By participating in this contest, the trucking industry in Alabama has the opportunity to demonstrate how committed we are to highway safety. Judges are from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration and the Alabama Law Enforcement Agency. The judges are impressed by the number of nominations for professional awards as well as the number of safety contest entries, so it is important that everyone is involved. All entries are due by Wednesday, February 22, 2023, this is an absolute deadline.

Award presentations will be made at the Annual Fleet Safety Awards Dinner on Friday March 31, 2023 at Pelham Civic Complex, Pelham, AL.

ALABAMA TRUCKING ASSOCIATION TRUCK SAFETY CONTEST ANNUAL REPORT FORM FOR 2022

A separate report must be filed for **each** major division representing a type of service performed within the state. Accidents and frequency rates must be listed for **Alabama state-wide operations**, <u>not system-wide</u>. Frequency rates shall be expressed in terms of the number of accidents per one million miles traveled as determined by the following formula:

Frequency = Number of accidents X 1,000,000 Total Miles

Entries must be received at the Association office by close of business on February 22, 2023. Presentations will be at the annual awards banquet at the **Pelham Civic Complex on Friday March 31, 2023.** Awards will be presented to the carriers with the **lowest DOT recordable** accident frequency in their class. In the event of a tie, the lowest **overall** accident frequency will be the deciding factor. In the event that this is also a tie, the carrier with the **most miles run** will be declared the winner. Certificates for improvement in DOT recordable and/or overall accident frequency from 2020 will also be presented.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ALABAMA TRUCKING ASSOCIATION STATE TRUCK SAFETY CONTEST

Except as noted below, all accidents regardless of preventability or non-preventability must be reported in accordance with the standards set forth in *Trucking Industry Guidelines for Recording Fleet Vehicle Accidents and Determining Preventability,* regardless of severity, who was killed or injured, who was at fault, or where the accident occurred (public highway or private property is not a factor). This refers to all accidents, not just DOT recordable accidents that occurred in Alabama.

A motor vehicle fleet accident is defined as any occurrence involving a fleet motor vehicle that results in death, injury, or property damage. It is the intent that those occurrences resulting because of errors in judgment or technique of drivers, or of maintenance, are to be considered motor vehicle fleet accidents, as follows:

- 1. Non-collision accidents of the upset, rollover, jackknife, or run-off-the-road type that result in death, injury, or property damage.
- 2. When abnormal driving causes the shifting of cargo which results in death, injury, or property damage.
- 3. Occurrences that result in death or injury to pedestrians or bystanders caused by contact with a moving vehicle, or an object carried on the vehicle or set in motion by the vehicle.
- 4. Occurrences that result in death, injury, or property damage caused by persons attempting to hitch rides on moving vehicles.
- 5. Damage to a roadway or driveway, on private property, driven over with the owner's consent, caused solely by the weight of the vehicle is not a motor vehicle fleet accident. If death, injury or property damage occurs because the vehicle accidentally skids or is driven off the driveway, it is a fleet accident.
- 6. Objects or liquids falling from a motor vehicle that cause, injury, death or property damage.

Common types of non-reportable accidents:

- 1. Collisions with animals that result in death or injury to the animal only and/or property damage which is limited to that resulting directly from impact with the animal.
- 2. Property parked vehicles are legally parked with the brake set, wheels chocked (if necessary) and the cab doors closed. Trailer doors may be open if they are secured.
- 3. Normal wear and tear (cumulative), visible damage to bumpers, rubrails, etc.
- 4. Road debris kicked up by traffic.
- 5. Falling/flying objects such as debris propelled by wind or falling from a construction site.
- 6. Ice/snow falling on or off a vehicle.
- 7. Any incident that results in no damage or injury.

- 5. Accident frequency: Determined by total reportable accidents for the entire fleet times one million miles divided by total miles operated by the entire fleet.
- 6. A brief personal resume to include activity as a member of the SMMC and other industry related activities.
- 7. Any other items or areas of interest that are pertinent to the nomination.
- 8. Any exhibits that will assist the judges.
