Only after you have exhausted all other avenues, will the driver be allowed to climb on the trailer or load. The last words out of your mouth should be telling the driver to watch his every step and be very, very careful. We want to remind the drivers to BE CAREFUL. Being careful needs to be on the drivers mind above all else.

Statements to make to the driver before approving access to the trailer:

- *Make sure your trailer is clear of trip hazards.*
- *Make sure that you are in a well-lit area.*
- *Make sure that you are mindful of where you are stepping, watch for trip hazards.*
- *Make sure that you are using 3-points of contact.*
- *Make sure that you call as soon as you are off the trailer.*
